What is Model United Nations?

Model UN provides the opportunity for students to debate contemporary world issues on the United Nations agenda. In retrospect, students become state ambassadors for the purpose of defending their country's view while debating these crucial areas of concern. Students write speeches, prepare draft resolutions, negotiate with allies and adversaries, resolve conflicts, and practice the conference rules of procedure within UN committees. This is all done in the interest of mobilizing "international cooperation" to resolve matters of contention within the contemporary world system. As the world continues to shift, the United Nations works to shift and adapt with it and its citizens. For this reason, and many more, Model UN conferences work to provide students with a world perspective in the effort to enhance the knowledge of the world we live in.

What are Simulations?

Two simulations will be held before the date of the conference in February and they exist as an opportunity to understand the process and language of Model United Nations. At these simulations, we teach students rules and procedures of committee sessions so that they are better prepared for the conference. We will provide an interactive simulation of a committee session with trained TCC Model United Nations members available to answer questions, offer support and direction. These simulations are not required for students attending TSMUN, however attendance to at least one is recommended for first time delegates.

GLOSSARY

(a list of common terms useful to potential advisors)

- **Background Guide** (BG) your background information is provided to you by your committee Director. She/he has put together information relevant to your committee and its topics. Using the background guide will give you a good start towards researching your topics and how to resolve them.
- **Delegation** a delegation is the entire makeup of your team representing a country. You may represent one or more countries during this conference and each country equals a delegation.
- **Director** the person most responsible for putting together your Background Guide and running your committee. If you have any questions or concerns, he is the person you should address.
 - **Head Delegate** an experienced member of your team, who helps teach and support fellow members with their country's profile, and committee's topics.
- In Character acting as a professional delegate of your country, personifying the aims, ideals, and goals of your country, and not deviating from them in any way.
 - **Member State** a member nation of the United Nations with voting rights.
- **Position Paper** your country's official stance regarding the topics in your committee.
- **Secretariat** this body consists of the Secretary General, Director General, Undersecretary General, and Deputy Director General.
